163rd Winnipeg Spring Camp 2015

All items should be labeled with the youth's names.

Cubs and Scouts should do their own packing so that they know where to find their gear.

Beaver Families will need to bring a tent for themselves, tents provided for older youth.

Full uniform T-shirts (3) Long sleeve shirt Shorts (2) Warm pants Jacket or warm hoody/ sweater Rain jacket and pants OR rain poncho Rain boots Gloves and hat PJs Underwear (4) Socks (4 pairs) Wide brimmed hat Running shoes (preferably not skater shoes) Pirate wear (as you like)	Small back pack/ day pack Sleeping bag Foam pad Extra blanket or campfire blanket Towel and face cloth Toothbrush and paste Soap Sunscreen Bug spray/ lotion Survival / first aid kits (made by cubs during the year) Lawn chair Compass (if you have one – we have a few extras) Flashlight or headlamp	plate bowl cup with lid table knife spoon fork mesh bag (storage and drying) Water bottle all items should be non-breakable!

Pocket knife – with parent's permission only.

Scouts – must also bring knife safety permit

Cubs – must give them to a leader on arrival. They will be able to use it only when supervised.

Beavers – no knives (includes Whitetails)

NO electronics (cell phones, Game boys, Nintendo DS, iPods, etc). These will be confiscated by leaders and returned at the end of camp. Cameras are OK.

Families and youth do not need to bring food, all food will be provided by the group.

EAT SUPPER BEFORE COMING TO CAMP FRIDAY NIGHT. Campers should come fed. Late night snack will be provided.
